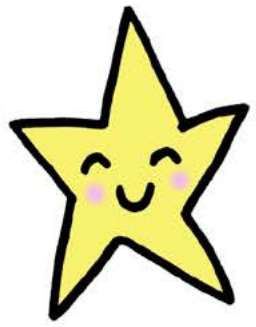


# LITTER CHAMPIONS!

# Jar Lid Badges!

## You will need:

- Recycled clean jar lid
- Gluestick
- Scissors
- Pencil
- Collage materials
- Badge fastening of your choice

+ MAGAZINES



WRAPPING PAPER



### Step 1:

Choose a piece of collage material as your badge background. Place your badge face down on your collage material and draw around it with a pencil to make a circle outline!



### Step 2:

Cut out your circle and press it in to the inside of your jar lid. It should fit snugly inside (you can put a dab of glue underneath to hold it in place if you like)

### Step 3:

Explore your collage material to find some fun letters and pictures to add on top of your background. Remember to think about the size and how many letters you will need to fit in to the space.



**Tip:** Before you stick any of these bits down, place them in position to check that you have enough space. When you are happy it all fits in, then glue everything in place!



### Step 4:

Attach a badge backing of your choice to the back of your jar lid.

It could be a safety pin attached with strong tape or you could even glue your jar lid on top of an old recycled badge.

Now your badge is ready to wear!

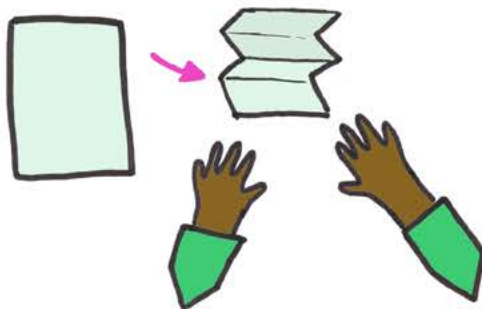


# Litterbug Posters!

A 'Litterbug' is the name someone is given if they drop Litter!

## Step 1:

Take a sheet of recycled plain paper and fold it in half, and then fold it in half again.

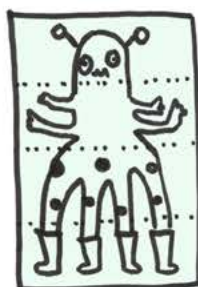


When you open the paper out, it should now be folded in to 4 equal sections.

## Step 3:

Fold your drawing over and pass to the person to your left. Everyone should have a new piece of paper.

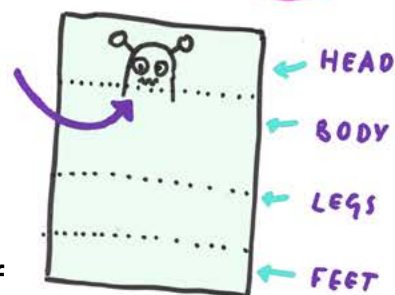
Everyone draws a litterbug body in the next section.



Remember to keep the paper folded as it's being passed around - no peeking!

## Step 2:

Working in a group of 4, each person draws a Litterbug head in the top section of the paper.



Draw the neck line until just below the crease, so the next person will be able to see it when folded.

## Step 4:

Repeat until all 4 sections are complete. Then unfold your papers to reveal your group Litterbugs!



## Step 5:

Cut out your Litterbug and stick on a piece of colourful recycled paper. Cut letters from junk mail to add a message to your poster!

# Pledge Postcards!

**Step 1:** Cut out 2 Postcard size rectangles from some recycled cereal boxes.



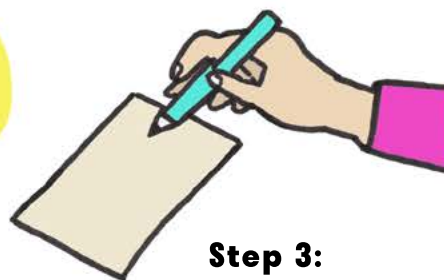
## Step 2:

Using a gluestick, stick them together so you can only see plain cardboard on both sides.



## Step 4:

Using coloured pens write up your 3 pledges in a bright and eye-catching way. Use bubble writing and drawings to help.



## Step 3:

Think about 3 'Pledges' (promises) you could make to help with Litter, and do your bit for the environment.



## Step 5:

Think of someone you would like to give it to, to encourage them to join in with your Litter Pledges too!
